<p>"Who oversees the compliance of the project against it's regulatory obligations?"</p>	<p>Compliance is overseen by several federal agencies, including the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, Canadian Transportation Agency, Fisheries and Oceans Canada, Transport Canada, Health Canada, Natural Resources Canada, and Environment and Climate Change Canada.</p>	<p>CN is required to submit regular reports and is subject to inspections to demonstrate compliance with applicable regulatory requirements.</p>
<p>"There are concerns about data that CN is gathering related to air and water quality. How are the reports available and can a lay person understand them."</p>	<p>CN has developed and is implementing Air Quality and Surface Water Quality/Quantity Follow-up Programs. These programs were prepared in consultation with regulators and Indigenous communities, as required under the Decision Statement. Details are available on the CN Milton website.</p>	<p>In line with the approved monitoring frequency and duration set out in these programs, CN submits monitoring reports to the agencies and communities involved in their development. In the past, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada has also made these reports publicly available through its online registry.</p>

How will traffic on those roads be monitored and by whom?”</p>	<p>CN has developed a comprehensive plan to manage project-related traffic and reduce impacts on local roads. Key measures include a 1.7-kilometre private road and on-site queuing area to keep trucks off municipal streets, a new CN-funded underpass at Lower Base Line, upgrades to key intersections, a separate employee entrance on Tremaine Road, and routing CN-controlled trucks to Highway 407.</p>	<p>Traffic studies were completed as part of the project planning process to model potential traffic movements. These studies were reviewed by Regional Municipality of Halton, which is responsible for overseeing public road infrastructure. Ongoing monitoring and management of public roads falls under the jurisdiction of the Region of Halton and relevant municipal authorities.</p>

Focus Area: Heritage Sub-Committee

The Heritage Sub-committee was formed in 2022 with a mandate to explore opportunities and give feedback to the Milton Logistics Hub Project team related to the heritage properties at 5269 and 5381 Tremaine Road. Opportunities were explored to move the houses, use the houses and/or barns at current locations or salvage materials from both houses and barns. A number of opportunities have been explored resulting in the barn at 5381 currently being used by a local business. The house at 5381 has been fast-tracked for salvage of materials due to the state of degradation of the house. Salvage is expected in mid-2026 by a local vendor.

The beautiful brick house at 5381 Tremaine is currently protected against further degradation as well as vandalism while the sub-committee pursues the concept of a multi-user not-for-profit hub supporting the local community.

Sub-committee members include Allan Ehrlick (Halton Region Federation of Agriculture), Nancy Mott (community member) and Wendy Roberts (community member, former CCC member).

Volunteer Committee Member Profile: **Larry Chambers-Public At Large member**

Larry W. Chambers has authored 189 articles and books on community prevention and control of disease and disorders, including influenza, and health promotion programs for older adults. International journals have published his work on design, measurement and evaluation of health programs such as organizational change to improve long term care homes prevention of infectious disease. He has enhanced capacity of governmental and non-governmental partner agencies by connecting research and innovation projects to policy and strategies. His expertise also lies in assembling, managing and leading interdisciplinary research and innovation project teams involving clinicians, faculty and public health. Professor Chambers presently is research director of the Niagara Regional Campus, School of Medicine, McMaster University. In addition to his work with his consulting company, he maintains appointments with the Department of Research Methods, Evidence and Impact, McMaster University (Professor Emeritus); as well as with the Bruyère Research Institute; School of Epidemiology and Public Health, University of Ottawa, Faculty of Health, York University; and, the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences. From 2013 to 2017, he was scientific advisor to the Alzheimer Society of Canada. Larry is a Fellow with the American College of Epidemiology, Honorary Fellow with the Faculty of Public Health of the United Kingdom and Fellow with the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences.
